Wednesday 24 January 7.30pm One Fine Morning (Un beau matin) (15)

France 2022 | 1hr 52m Dir: Mia Hansen-Løve | Cast: Léa Seydoux, Pascal Greggory | Language: French (subtitled) | Awards: 4 wins, 7 nominations

Sandra, a young widow and single parent battling to obtain the best care for her ailing father while tending to her young daughter, finds solace with a friend from the past, now unhappily married. With a new-found intimacy, the relationship offers respite from her loneliness and juggling family responsibilities.

Underpinned by the theme of fielding life's roller-coaster vicissitudes, the film's story is conveyed poignantly throughout, transposing into unexpected positivity.

With deliberate economy, we watch the early years of Chile's Pinochet regime from the cushioned viewpoint of a privileged doctor's wife.

Carmen goes about her day, while the daily danger of ordinary people being snatched from the streets is only hinted at. An opportunity to help the local priest to shelter injured activist Elías could alter her perspective.

Would being part of the élite which bolstered Pinochet's rule guarantee her protection, or further endanger Elías's safety?

Na Young and Hae Sung are inseparable childhood friends who walk home together after school. Parted by events over which, as children, they have no control, their lives must of necessity diverge. Does an old love become extinct, or can it linger under the surface?

An impressive debut from writer-director Celine Song, here is a reflective focus on two charming characters who draw the audience into their lives through their tender and honest humanity.

Abel, a troubled, protective son, is convinced that his mother's new beau Michel, the former burglar whom she met while running a prison workshop, is up to his old tricks. As he tracks Michel's movements, Abel's suspicions are heightened. Spurred on with best friend Clémence in tow, he risks getting embroiled in something shady.

A smart mix of tense action, likeable characters and fabulous French humour.

Set in the leafy beauty of rural Ireland during the early '80s, this simple tale raises nature versus nurture ponderings. Cáit is a child who lives in a state of loneliness amidst a crowded household, where she is either ignored or berated. While fostered out for the summer, she experiences a cathartic change. Adapted from a novella by Claire Keegan, here's a quietly impressive directorial launch with frugal dialogue and a delicate pace that nonetheless carries emotional punch.

Absorbing intrigue with a stunning backdrop of the Alps of south-east France. A writer couple live alongside their partially-sighted son and the family's dog in an isolated chalet. When a shocking incident triggers a raft of doubts and questions, the case leads to crackling courtroom interaction and a conflicted key witness.

With its avalanche of uncertainties, this is riveting, family-anchored drama portrayed by a thoroughly convincing cast.
